The rays from the darker subjects are largely composed of those toward the red end of the spectrum, the reds, oranges, and yellows, whose action upon the film or plate is comparatively slow. In the light reflected from snow, clouds, and sky, however, is a much larger proportion of blue and violet rays, whose effect upon the plate is unduly violent.
